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FORMAT

- Night courses meet twice per week.
- EDUG 401, 402, and 404 night courses are offered in a hybrid format. Courses meet in-person for the first session and synchronously online for the second session of the week.
- All daytime EDUG courses will remain 100% in-person.

ADVISING

- Faculty advisors support CAS Undergraduate students on the pathway to earn a bachelor's degree.
- Advisors in the Student Success Center provide a variety of advising services to support CAS/SOE Undergraduate students with School of Education courses, fieldwork, and credential requirements.

CLINICAL FIELDWORK

- Undergraduate students will complete student teaching.
- Students completing fieldwork at the graduate level (credential or master's degree program) have the option to student teach or intern.

PRELIMINARY CREDENTIAL REQUIREMENTS

Once fieldwork is successfully completed and all preliminary credential requirements have been met, students must apply to be recommended for the Preliminary Teaching Credential.

- **Subject Matter Competency:** Must be met by the designated student teaching application deadline.
- **US Constitution Requirement:** Can be met by taking POLI 111: Intro to American Politics or HIST 121: American History to 1877. Other options are available to meet this requirement.
- **CPR Certificate:** Must be completed to apply for student teaching.
- **CalTPA Cycles:** Must be completed during fieldwork.

EARN A MASTER'S DEGREE + TEACHING CREDENTIAL

Undergraduate students at the University of Redlands can complete up to 18 credit hours of degree work toward a Master of Arts in Education, Learning and Teaching (MALT) as undergraduates. This pathway to a profession in education helps to create a professional path to being a teacher for those undergraduates who have identified education as their passion early in their college experience.
