

## **Philosophy: The Big Picture**

Philosophy engages with big philosophical questions and ideas that have profoundly affected human life and culture. At Redlands, students consider these both in the Western tradition and in the context of Chinese philosophy. They consider ideas such as human rights, the social contract, skepticism, the relation between mind and body, the significance of family and human relations (a central concern of Confucianism), the natural way of life (Daoism), or the path to enlightenment (Buddhism).

While it seems really abstract at first, Philosophy has a very practical side: students grapple with contemporary issues that apply philosophical insights to ethics and public policy: Do we have free will? How should we punish criminals? Do animals have rights? What are the moral constraints on medical practice and the implications of medical technologies?

Studying philosophy can enrich our lives, enhancing our capacities for self-reflection, creative and analytical thinking, and responsible citizenship. The skills and habits of mind developed through studying philosophy are useful in many professional and career pursuits. Philosophy graduates flourish in a variety of careers in the public and private sectors. They can be found in every field from high tech to law, business, education, and the world of non-profit organizations.

## What Philosophy Students Do

- Many select second majors or minors to pursue additional interests and expand their skills, training and opportunities.
- After graduation, many pursue graduate study, in fields such as:
  - M.A. or Ph.D. in Philosophy
  - J.D. (Law degree)
  - Other professional training (e.g., teacher certification)
