BIOGRAPHIES

Paul Holley, director

Principal Guest Conductor of Gondwana Chorale, Paul Holley OAM is a graduate of the Queensland Conservatorium of Music and the Associate Director of Voices of Birralee conducting the Birralee Blokes and Resonance of Birralee. Both ensembles have toured nationally and internationally representing Australia at festivals and competitions, performed with the Queensland Symphony Orchestra and other professional ensembles, and made numerous recordings. In addition to these roles, Paul is a choral director and teacher at Brisbane Girls Grammar School and regularly features as guest conductor/clinician at festivals, conferences and music competitions throughout Australia. In 2016, Paul was awarded the Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) for his services to music.

Carl Crossin, director

Conductor, educator and composer Carl Crossin OAM is Associate Professor of Music at University of Adelaide's Elder Conservatorium of Music where he is Head of Vocal, Choral & Conducting Studies and teaches conducting. He also directs the Elder Conservatorium Chorale and the Adelaide Symphony & Festival Choruses. Carl is Founder, Artistic Director and Conductor of the multi-award winning Adelaide Chamber Singers, an internationally-acclaimed chamber choir. Carl's guest conducting appearances have included Sydney Philharmonia, Melbourne Chorale, Sydney Chamber Choir, Brisbane Chamber Choir and The Giovanni Consort. He has also been a guest conductor, presenter and adjudicator at festivals and competitions throughout Australia and internationally, including in Britain, South East Asia, New Zealand and North America. He is a graduate of the Sydney Conservatorium of Music and the University of Adelaide. He has also undertaken postgraduate studies at Westminster Choir College, Princeton in the United States.

Nicholle Andrews, director

Originally from Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada, Nicholle Andrews is Director of Choral Studies at the University of Redlands. Under her direction, the choral ensembles at Redlands have performed at national and international festivals. She is in high demand across North America as a conductor, adjudicator, and clinician.

Under her direction, choirs at the University of Redlands have been invited to perform at festival and conferences such as the National Collegiate Choral Organization (NCCO) Convention, California Music Educators Association (CMEA) Convention, CASMEC California All State Music Educators Conference and Festival 500 Sharing the Voices.

Andrews is currently training as a body mapping clinician (Andover Educator). Her areas of research include the study of performance anxiety in musicians, pitch perception, and awareness of the body through conducting. Her publications can be found in sources such as the Journal of Research in Music Education.

In January 2013, Andrews created the University of Redlands Youth Choir as a training program for children from surrounding communities, and music education students at the university. The program is now in it's fourth year and has grown in numbers allowing the creation of a training chorus (ages 4-7) as a feeder ensemble for the youth choir (ages 8-14).

Having completed her doctorate and master's in choral conducting at McGill University, Andrews studied with Professor Iwan Edwards, Dr. John Baboukis, and Dr. Julian Wachner. While at McGill University she taught musicianship, instrumental conducting and choral conducting. She completed a double Bachelors of Music in oboe performance and music education at Memorial University of Newfoundland where she studied conducting with Dr. Douglas Dunsmore.

ABOUT THE ENSEMBLES

Gondwana Chorale Australia's National University-Level Youth Choir

Established in 2008, Gondwana Chorale has performed nationally in Australia and internationally in New Zealand (2011), the United Kingdom and France (2013). Gifted singers of the Gondwana Chorale come from throughout Australia and range in age from 17 - 26. The sound of Gondwana Chorale is vibrant and energetic, indicative of their intensive rehearsal process and the joy of singing together.

In 2015 the choir formed the Gondwana Centenary Chorale with young singers from Turkey, France and New Zealand to commemorate the centenary of the Gallipoli campaign, giving the world premiere of James Ledger's *War Music* with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. In January 2017 Gondwana Chorale will undertake its first tour to the USA.

SOAR is Gondwana Chorale's debut recording and presents a program typical of the ensemble – a rich and varied collection of repertoire with a strong focus on contemporary Australian compositions which lies at the heart of Gondwana Choirs' ethos. The music on this disc ranges from the Spanish Renaissance to present day Australia, including Paul Stanhope's *Lament to St Cecilia*, a technically demanding tour de force of emotional intensity commissioned for the choir in 2013 for its European Tour. It is now available on iTunes.

Gondwana Choirs is praised with performance excellence and has a well-deserved reputation for the highest standards of young people's choral music in Australia and internationally. Singers from all three arms of the organization, Sydney Children's Choir, Gondwana National Choirs and Gondwana Indigenous Children's Choir, have come together on several occasions, most notably in 2014 with Sydney Symphony Orchestra for the world premiere performances of *Jandamarra: Sing for the Country* by Paul Stanhope.

Gondwana Choirs has received many awards and recognition of their

work, including the 2015 APRA/AMCOS award for Excellence by an Organization for its artistic program in our 25th year, and significant contribution to Australian music since 1989. Gondwana Choirs' Founder and Artistic Director Lyn Williams OAM was named in the 100 Women of Influence in 2015, and is engaged nationally and internationally for her expertise in choral training.

Alumni of Gondwana Choirs are now employed by the Australian Chamber Orchestra, Sydney and Melbourne Symphony Orchestras and Opera Australia, and regularly appear at Pinchgut Opera, Covent Garden, Glyndebourne Festival and the Deutsche Oper Berlin.
