Hannah Gaugush '23, trumpet

Hannah is a third-year student at the University of Redlands, working to earn a Bachelor of Music in Trumpet Performance and a Bachelor of Arts in Management. She began playing trumpet more than a decade ago and started her own private trumpet studio in 2017. From 2015 to 2019, Hannah studied with Chuck Colburn and now

studies with Dr. David Scott at the University of Redlands. Hannah is proud and grateful to be attending the university as a Director's Award scholarship recipient. She is currently principal cornet for the University of Redlands Wind Ensemble and principal trumpet for the University Orchestra. Having passed the RSO Student Qualifying Audition in 2021, Hannah will be playing with the Redlands Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Maestro Ransom Wilson at the upcoming March concert. In 2019, as a senior in high school, Hannah won first place at the WMEA Washington State Solo and Ensemble Festival in the solo trumpet category. She has also been a part of three ensembles that successfully entered the semi-finals of the National Trumpet Competition.



Jose Luis Becerra '24, clarinet

Jose is a sophomore pursuing a Bachelor of Music degree in Clarinet Performance and has been playing for eight years. In that time, he has studied with Juan Gallegos and Dr. Kathryn Nevin. She is also the principal flute in the University of Redlands Wind Ensemble, is the flutist with one of the top Woodwind Quintets, and is a member of the Flute Choir. In addition to the prestigious honor of being chosen to perform in today's 2022 President's Honor Recital, Christian recently auditioned and won a coveted student substitute position with the Redlands Symphony Orchestra under the direction of Maestro Ransom Wilson and will be performing with the RSO this May.

A native of Southern California, Jace has been pursuing a Bachelor of Music in Violin Performance with a minor in German at the University of Redlands since 2018. Alongside his work as a performer both at the university and in the community, Jace has a passion for teaching and passing down to the next generation of violinists the knowledge he has acquired during his study with Professor Fischer and his other musical mentors.

The Queen's Six was established in 2008, the 450th anniversary



of the accession of Queen Elizabeth I, from whom they take their name. Based at Windsor Castle, members of The Queen's Six make up part of the Lay Clerks of St George's Chapel, whose homes lie within the Castle walls. The Chapel Choir, which consists of boy trebles and twelve professional adult singers, performs some eight services a week, as well as at private and state occasions, often before the Royal Family. In 2018, group members' duties with the Chapel Choir included singing for the wedding of Prince Harry and Ms. Meghan Markle, now the Duke and Duchess of Sussex; and in 2021, three members of the group sang at the funeral of HRH Prince Philip, the Duke of Edinburgh.

Now Lissie, Tom, Nick, Dom, Andrew and Simon have come together to bring their unique style of entertainment to a much wider audience. Their repertoire extends far beyond the reach of the choir stalls: from austere early chant, florid Renaissance polyphony, lewd madrigals and haunting folk songs, to upbeat Jazz and Pop arrangements.
