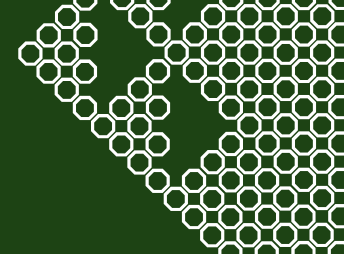

- Application includes subject matter competency and recommendation letters. See all requirements and details on [Teaching Internship webpage](#).

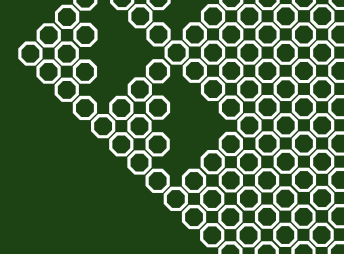
ADVISING

PRELIMINARY CREDENTIAL REQUIREMENTS

- [Subject Matter Competency](#): Must be met by the designated student teaching application deadline or after semester 1 for internship eligibility.
- [CPR Certificate](#): Recommend to complete during semester 1.
- [US Constitution Requirement](#): Recommend to complete during semester 1.
- [EDSP Workshop](#): The Health and AAC Workshops must be completed before advancing the fieldwork. Complete during semester 1 or 2.
- [RICA Exam](#): Must be met for Preliminary Credential recommendation. Recommend to complete after meeting subject matter competency.
- [CalTPA Cycle 1 and 2](#): Must be met for Preliminary Credential recommendation. Will be completed during student teaching or internship.
